Wool Combs
Dog Comb
NOTE: The carders will not be used until class 2, the
combs until class 3.
3x5 cards
Avery hang tags for labeling skeins
3-inch notebook with sheet protectors

For first class:

- 1) spin a two ounce skein: two ply like you normally spin. Measure it, tag it with length, breed, fiber prep, time to spin, PLUS before plying, wrap 3 yards as a single around a 3 x 5 card and attach to skein with tag.
- 2) bring samples of your previous spinning that you have used to make something knit, woven, etc.
- 3) bring two bobbins with at least 1 oz wool on each to practice plying, one bobbin for plying and Lazy Kate
